Extension Activities: Bring Your Needs and Thirst to the Lord

In this activity, kids will eat crackers and have a special prayer time

Prepare: Find a <u>picture of the Desert of Zin</u> at the link below. Print it or show it on your laptop. Bring: saltine <u>crackers</u>, <u>plates</u>, <u>cups</u>, <u>water</u>. Optional: Create an atmosphere for prayer: <u>mats</u>, <u>rugs</u>, <u>soft music</u>, <u>electric candles</u> https://biblicalhistoricalcontext.com/assets/images/exodus-itineraries/zin.png

Do: Give the kids some saltine crackers. Do not give them anything to drink (just yet). **Say:** Look at this picture of the Desert of Zin. It was in the Wilderness of Sin in the Sinai Peninsula between Egypt and the land of Canaan. While you eat these crackers, describe it to me. (deserted, dry, barren, hot, arid, thirsty, parched, waterless, lifeless, blistering). **Say:** The desert areas around Israel are supremely harsh. Even driving through those desolate, vast stretches of rock and mountains and sand in an air-conditioned car, you know that if your car breaks down, you could be in real trouble. **Ask:** What kind of trouble could you get in? What do you think would grow or live there? How would you feel if you had to walk through the desert or live there? (scared, alone, forgotten, worried, thirsty, abandoned, forgotten) If you lived there, what food or drink would you miss?

Read Numbers 20:1-5. **Say**: At God's direction, Moses was leading the entire Jewish population through the desert to Canaan. It was called the Promised Land because God promised to bring them into this land that was flowing with milk and honey. In other words, it was a sweet land with water, grass, and shade that would meet their needs. But they weren't there yet. They were stuck in the desert and they were THIRSTY. **Ask**: How does it feel to be thirsty? What did Moses do when he was faced with this impossible situation?

Read Numbers 20:6: "Moses and Aaron went from the assembly to the entrance to the tent of meeting and fell facedown, and the glory of the LORD appeared to them." **Say**: The tent of meeting was like their church. How does laying down before the Lord change you? **Say**: Let's go to the Lord, like Moses did, with our needs. Let's either kneel or lay down and quietly tell the Lord what you need. Trust him. Ask him to meet your needs.

Do: While the kids are still thirsty, **turn the lights down. Say:** Sometimes we go through times in our own lives that feel like we are in a desert – alone, miserable, forgotten. God will come through for you, too. **Give them some quiet time** to talk to the Lord silently about their needs. Make the offer to **pray** with those who would like that. Tell the kids they are welcome to kneel or lay down. Lay out some mats or <u>rugs</u>. You might want to play some soft, instrumental <u>music</u>. After the prayer time, give each child a cup of cold water. **Read:** Numbers 20:11.

Bright Idea: Make this time of prayer an ongoing tradition in your classroom.

Extension Activities: Who Really Gave Them Water?

In this activity, kids will read a letter and act out giving the credit to God.

Prepare: Print one of the <u>following pages</u> for each child. Fill in their name on the line. Fold them and write the names on the outside of the folded paper. Put them all in a box and <u>aift wrap the box</u>. Put in on a shelf.

Ask: Why was God upset with Moses? Read aloud Numbers 20:9-13. Say: Moses should have said something like, "Watch the glory of the Lord. He is going to do a miracle. God himself is going to provide water. He will bring it out of a rock! When you drink the water, thank God for providing for you in this miraculous way." But Moses said, "Must WE bring you water out of this rock?" Ask: How did his words steal from God? Say: God watches our actions and our words. We must be careful to not take credit away from God. He gave us everything and we need to praise him and tell others the truth – that God is the one who gives and HE deserves the credit. Honor God as Holy. Give him the praise.

Do: Reach up and bring down the gift box as though you are getting it from God. Let the kids open the box and read their letters. **Say**: God is the one who gives us our gifts and talents. It's easy to forget our unseen God when we get a compliment. Let's say that you played a song on the piano. Your friends and family say to you, "You are amazing. You are so talented." Hopefully, you will respond with thanks but it's a great habit to also share the credit with God. After all, He is the one who gave you parents who paid for your lessons. God is the one who gave you the talent to remember the chords and provides our teachers. So, let's not be like Moses who took the praise away from God." Practice this in pairs. One kid gives a compliment to his partner. She will say thanks and then give the credit to God. Use these examples:

Calvin: Wow, you really hit that ball out of the park. You're amazing! **Chris:** Thanks. I'm so grateful for God's help.

Alina: You look so pretty! I love that dress.

Rachel: Thank you! God gave me a wonderful grandma who bought it.

Bright Idea!

Follow up for your next lesson: Use the same letter from God and turn them into prayers back to God: Thank you, God, for my health. I had the flu last week and YOU cured me. Thanks for the doctor and medicine. Thank you for my mom who took care of me. You are so kind. Amen.



Extension Activities: Whines and Wails or Please and Praise?

In this activity, kids will create a prayer journal to use as a daily habit.

Prepare: Print several of the <u>Prayers and Praises page</u> for each child.


Read Numbers 20:1-6. **Ask:** How did the people act when they started to get thirsty? Did they go to God with their needs? How did they treat Moses? Say: Moses – with God's mighty help – rescued the Israelites out of slavery. When the whole population walked right through the Red Sea, their lives were spared and their enemies, the Egyptian army, was drowned. God again spared their lives by sending them through the desert on their way to the Promised Land. Why? The ferocious Philistines lived along that route, and so God was sparing them again. The Israelites could have gone to God with their needs but instead just complained to Moses. Don't we do that sometimes? Let's learn to bring our complaints, needs, and even our thanks and praises to God. Look at your Prayers and Praises paper. If the Israelites were filling it out, what might the Prayers column have asked God for? (water, safety, food, shelter, strength to get to the Promised Land). What might the Praises column have thanked God for? (freedom from slavery, escape through the Red Sea, all 2.4 million people getting out of Egypt, sparing them from war with the Philistines, Moses for his leadership, providing for them all along, the hope ahead).



Stop whining and start praying! Stop wailing and start thanking God for all the ways he has and is blessing you! If you don't already have a daily "Quiet Time" with the Lord, this is a areat way to start. Print a page for every new day. Punch holes and put the pages into a 3-ring binder. Read a chapter or passage from the Bible and fill in the chart. When God answers, check the boxes. It will become your best habit!

Extension Activities: NOTHING Like Clean, Fresh Water!

In this activity, kids will support a mission that provides clean water.

Prepare: Spend some time exploring His Hands Mission International online. http://hishandsmission.com/ Be prepared to show the children this 4-minute video: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=mVngye1_HQ&t=5s

Add to a bottle of water, a pinch of dirt, sand, and tiny twigs.

Ask: What was the number one problem the Israelites had in the desert? Why is water so important? **Say:** Water is essential to life. Some people in dry African countries don't have enough water. Now, some countries do have enough water. The problem is that their water is often dirty and full of tiny, invisible worms and germs that can be dangerous. When children drink the water, the tiny worms in their stomach and grow. Those poor children get sick and can't grow right. The water from the streams and ponds often looks like this.

Pass around the bottle of dirty water. **Ask**: Does your drinking water ever look like this? **Say**: One American missionary named Joel Aycock moved to a poor country called Honduras. He began to build filters to clean the water. When a village gets clean water, the children feel well enough to go to school and their lives improve. It only costs \$75 to bring a filter to a house that will serve around 10 people for 20 years of healthy, pure water!

Together, **think of ways that your class can raise** \$75: a toy or cookie sale, home chores. Get some bottles (for example from Ensure). Empty, clean, and remove the labels. Ask friends and family to drop a few quarters into the bottle. Put your money together as a class and see what the Lord does. He brought water out of a rock for the Israelites. God can help you bring clean water to poor kids!
