Suggestions: You can add ...

<u>Simple costumes</u>: For the angel: gold tinsel in a wreath around the head, white sheet. For Mary: a scarf.

<u>Sound effects</u>: for God's deep voice use a microphone that is used for karaoke. After the first line, have the kids hum "Here Comes the Bride" or use romantic music.

<u>Props</u>: Print a big poster with the word YES. Shine a light from behind the angel.

Special Effects: Toss confetti after she says "yes."
